**Job Duties:** Teach high school students ASL as a foreign language through Interactive Video Distance Learning (IVDL).

Instructs students in a well disciplined, managed, and creative classroom by: developing learning goals/lesson plans that are appropriate for students and are aligned with the school's curriculum or state standards; demonstrating an understanding of the connections between the content that was learned previously, the current content, and the content that remains to be learned; creating and selecting teaching methods, learning activities, and instructional materials or other resources that are appropriate to the students and are aligned with the goals of the lesson/unit; creating or selecting evaluation strategies that are appropriate for the students and that are aligned with the goals of the lesson/unit; creating a climate that promotes equity; establishing and maintaining professional rapport with students; establishing and maintaining consistent standards of classroom behavior; making the physical environment safe and conducive to learning; operating technology associated with IVDL classroom and reporting problems to the technology department as needed; and developing online instruction using MOODLE for IVDL classes to access when live instruction is not available. Assesses/monitors student progress by: determining the extent to which individual student's learning goals were met; keeping records on academic performance and attendance; conducting tests (Standardized and State Proficiency) in accordance with OSD policy and state law as requested; reporting cases of suspected child abuse to administration and/or law enforcement authorities according to state law; making referrals for special services on an as needed basis; communicating with parents or guardians about student learning; participating as a member of the IEP team (collecting academic information, participating as a team member during the conference, and documenting IEP progress); conducting parent-teacher conferences on an as needed basis.

### Minimum Qualifications

Must maintain valid Ohio certification and/or licensure in the education of the hearing impaired (K-12), and/or Multi-age (P-12) American Sign Language. Must demonstrate advanced level of ASL on SLPI rating. Demonstrate the ability to communicate effectively with students, parents, and other staff members by using: American Sign Language; Written/Spoken English; and Electronic Communication Systems.

**Conditions for Employment:** Employment is contingent upon successful completion of criminal background check. The final applicant for this position will be required to submit to urinalysis prior to appointment to test for illegal drug use. An applicant with a positive test result will not be offered employment. Unless otherwise instructed, submit a separate application or resume for each job opportunity posting in which you are interested. Enter the classification and position control number (PN) of the position for which you are applying at the top of the front page of the application. You must demonstrate on your application how you meet the minimum qualifications for this position. Failure to do so will result in your application being screened out and you will not be granted an interview for this position.
